

## How to Participate in the 2021 IECC Development Process

### Three Steps to Help Put America’s Model Energy Code on a Glide Path to Net Zero

<a href="#">Join (or update) your ICC Governmental Membership</a> , pay dues, and name your “Primary Representative”	<b>Primary Reps must register all</b> “Governmental Member Voting Representatives” (GMVRs) with ICC	Vote in-person and promote proposals at ICC Public Comment Hearing in Las Vegas (biggest impact) <b>OR</b> Vote online via ICC’s ‘CDP Access’, and assure <u>all</u> GMVRs cast their votes

#### STEP 1: [Register](#) as a “Governmental Member” with the International Code Council (ICC)

Register as a Governmental Member, identify your Primary Representative, and pay your annual dues **by March 29, 2019**. See table for ICC registration cost & number of GMVRs allowed per Governmental Member.

Jurisdiction population	0-50,000	50,001-150,000	Over 150,000
Number of allotted GMVRs per ICC-registered Governmental Member	4	8	12
Annual ICC dues per registered department	\$135	\$240	\$370

**ICC definition for GMVRs:** GMVRs shall be designated in writing, by the Governmental Member, and shall be employees or officials of the Governmental Member or departments of the Governmental Member, provided that each of the designated voting representatives shall be an employee or a public official actively engaged either full or part time, in the administration, formulation, implementation or enforcement of laws, ordinances, rules or regulations relating to the public health, safety and welfare.

#### STEP 2: **Confirm all GMVRs are registered with ICC by September 23!**

This is the most critical action! Only GMVRs registered by this date will be eligible to cast a vote in November 2019!

#### STEP 3: **Attend the ICC Public Comment Hearing (PCH) in Las Vegas and cast your early vote for pro-efficiency proposals**

Attending the PCH is the best opportunity to get pro-efficiency proposals onto the online ballot. EECC will distribute more information on specific proposals, available scholarships for attending, and other info closer to the date.

#### **VOTE ONLINE. And make sure others do!**

For those unable to vote in person, online voting starts two weeks after the PCH. EECC’s forthcoming Voting Guide will help you vote efficiently. We recommend you host a “voting event” (e.g., lunchtime pizza party), to encourage votes to be cast and promote a culture of unified pro-efficiency in your jurisdiction.
